Georgia Court of Appeals,

On December 20, 2022 **the Georgia Supreme Court overturned lower court rulings** in *Favorito et al v. Wan et al* and *Jeffords et al v. Fulton County*. The Supreme Court confirmed that citizens, residents, taxpayers, and voters always had standing in Georgia to sue government officials or agencies that violate the law. **Now, well over three months later the Court of Appeals has still not adopted the Georgia Supreme Court decision and remanded the cases to the lower court** as is normal court procedure.

The petitioners in both cases have provided concrete evidence of **Georgia election law violations and documentable claims of election fraud, errors and irregularities that impact all Georgia voters**. Nevertheless, the petitioners have still not been allowed full discovery that can prove their claims even though **their cases are now well over two years old**.

These cases are of grave concern to thousands of Georgia voters and millions more throughout America because they involve multiple federal elections. Nevertheless, the petitioners have endured a two-year struggle just to exercise their simple right of discovery to obtain the evidence they know can be used to help ensure future elections do not experience the problems of the past.

The serious nature of the Petitioners claims and evidence and the continual judicial disregard for their Constitutional rights has created **one of the greatest voting rights injustices in Georgia history**. This injustice has been further exacerbated by the lack of attention the Court of Appeals has paid to these cases since receiving them back from the Georgia Supreme Court last year. Therefore, we urge the court to fulfill its obligation and help alleviate this injustice by immediately adopting the Georgia Supreme Court decision and remanding the cases to the lower court as should have been done months ago.
